## **Interview**

Once the Student Application and Fee are submitted, and the requested documents are received, you will be contacted for an admission interview. At least one parent (preferably both) must be present with their student at the interview. The interview will include:

- Reviewing the completed Student Application
- Reviewing standardized test results and report cards
- A synopsis of the school policies and procedures, including academic and spiritual standards (The current edition is available on our web site at [www.cchs.us](http://www.cchs.us).)
- Explanation of course offerings and course registration

## **Decision**

The school will notify the applicant by phone, email, or letter of the Admissions Committee's decision within one week of the interview. Decisions are made on a rolling basis as applications are received. If a student is accepted, the school must receive the following before the application is processed and classes are scheduled:

- Florida Certificate of Immunization
- School physical (copy from previous Florida school is acceptable)
- Medical Information and Authorization for Treatment form
- Completed and signed Financial Agreement form

A biblical worldview is foundational to our mission, which is fulfilled through students acquiring biblical truth, applying biblical truth, and attaining their highest level of academic achievement.

## **Statement of Non-Discriminatory Policy**

## **Teacher Qualifications**

Teachers must meet the Florida State Department of Education requirements for accredited private schools. Calvary teachers will not only be considered for their professional expertise; they will also be evaluated for their ability to role model a Christian lifestyle and teach biblical principles integrative with the subject matter. They will be certified or certifiable by the Association of Christian Schools International and/or the Department of Education.



## EDUCATIONAL PHILOSOPHY

The CCHS philosophy rests on the belief that all truth is God's truth, and the Bible is the only inspired and infallible authoritative Word of God that contains that truth (2 Timothy 3:16-17). Therefore, the Bible must be foundational in all areas of a curriculum that is designed to enable pupils to develop to their full potential spiritually, mentally, socially, physically, and emotionally (Luke 2:52).

The historic Christian view of life as presented in the Bible is central to the focus of CCHS. Since God created and sustains everything through His Son, Jesus Christ, the universe and humanity are dynamically related to God and exist to glorify Him (Colossians 1:13-18). Man, being a sinner by nature and choice, cannot glorify or know God apart from accepting God's free gift of salvation through His Son (John 3:16, Ephesians 2:8,9). Man is recreated in God's image and restored to a position of true knowledge, righteousness, and holiness through faith in Jesus Christ (2 Corinthians 5:17).

A quality educational program must enable students to prepare for success in college, or other post-secondary programs. Graduates must also be equipped to succeed in the world of work and in building strong Christian homes. Therefore, curriculum that includes honors and dual-credit college classes with an emphasis on technology is essential. ## History

In 1999, Calvary Baptist Church began to lay plans to start a quality, college-preparatory Christian high school for the Northern Pinellas County area. In October, 1999 the church officially voted to begin Calvary Christian High School in the fall of 2000. In late June of 2000, Calvary hired its first full-time Administrator, Thomas J. Cathey. Mr. Cathey was an experienced administrator with over twenty-four years experience, and an Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI) board member.

On August 23, 2000, Calvary opened its doors with seven faculty members and 38 ninth and tenth graders. In 2001-2002, enrollment more than doubled to eighty students. While the first year students were pretty much "family," the juniors were eager to fulfill the roll of "upper classmen!" The third year (2002-03) was a historic year. It began with promoting the previous year's juniors into the first senior class. It was the first year with grades 9-12. Eighteen students became the first group of students to graduate from Calvary. The enrollment was 125 students. The faculty had grown to thirteen. Over the next couple of years, the school continued to grow and expand to more classrooms in the current building, while construction began on a new building at the corner of McMullen Booth Road and Drew Street. Enrollment reached 200 at the beginning of the 2005-06 school year. During the Christmas break of 2006, the school relocated to the new campus.

The school has continued to grow, not only in enrollment, but in academic offerings. Today, students have the opportunity to take dual credit college courses, advanced placement courses, as well as a full offering of college preparatory classes.

## Location

Calvary is located at 110 N. McMullen Booth Road, at the corner of Drew Street and McMullen Booth Road. The school is equipped with modern classrooms, a beautiful worship center, two science labs, computer lab, cafeteria, gymnasium and an art gallery. We are very excited about the newly added sports complex, "The Rock," which includes a stadium, weight room, and ample locker facilities.

## Dress Code

Calvary has a “standard of dress.” The purpose of our dress code is to encourage an environment that is conducive to learning. Research shows there is a direct correlation to a student’s performance and the dress code of the educational institution. The goal of the dress code is to address three areas: modesty, identity, and propriety. Students will be asked to change clothing that is too tight, immodest, or inappropriate.

Students are to be neat, modest, well-groomed, and in designated pants/shirt/skirt at all times during school hours. Students should dress modestly when attending activities on the school campus outside of school hours.

### Standard of Dress:

#### Guys

Shirts—Polo with school logo (navy, white, gray, or red) purchased from the school approved supplier. CCHS Team or organization polo may be worn if the color is navy, white, gray, or red.

Pants—Dockers (stone, navy, gray, or khaki) purchased anywhere (cargo pockets are not allowed). Pants may be flat or front pleated. NO bell-bottom, hipster, low rider, hip-hugger, or cargo pants (outside pockets) are permitted. A belt must be worn if pants do not fit securely around the waist.

Shorts—Docker-style knee-length dress shorts (stone, navy, gray, or khaki – with no cargo pockets). A belt must be worn if shorts do not fit securely around the waist.

Shoes—Comfortable shoes that fit securely on the foot for walking up and down stairs. Flip-flops and sandals may be worn.

#### Ladies

Shirt—Polo with school logo ((navy, white, gray, or red) purchased from the school approved supplier. CCHS Team or organization polo may be worn if the color is navy, white, gray, or red.

Pants—Dockers (stone, navy, gray or khaki) purchased anywhere (cargo pockets are not allowed). Pants may be flat or front pleated. NO hipster, low rise, or cargo pants (outside pockets) are permitted. A belt must be worn if pants do not fit securely around the waist.

Skirt—(stone, navy, gray, or khaki) The shortest part of the skirt may be no higher than 2 inches above the knee (i.e. if the skirt has a slit, the top of the slit cannot be higher than 2” above the knee).

Capri Pants or Shorts—Docker-style knee-length dress shorts or Capri pants in the following colors (stone, navy, gray, or khaki - with no cargo pockets). A belt must be worn if pants or shorts do not fit securely around the waist.

Shoes - Comfortable shoes that fit securely on the foot for walking up and down stairs. Flip-flops and sandals may be worn.

# ACADEMIC INFORMATION

## Graduation Requirements

There are three different curriculum programs at Calvary. These programs are designed to meet the academic needs of students of varied learning abilities and performance levels. Further details and course listings for each program are provided during the time of course registration.

## College Preparatory Program

Students in this program take the required courses to prepare them for acceptance at colleges or universities. The students must maintain a 2.0 grade point average (unweighted), serve 100 community service hours, and earn 26 credits from the following courses: (Bible=4; English=4; Math=4; Social Studies=3; Science=3; Foreign Language=2; Fine Arts=2; Health/PE=1; Computer/Technology=.5; Electives or additional courses in the previously listed subject areas=2.5).

## Honors College Preparatory Program

Students in this program take the rigorous and demanding courses to prepare them for acceptance at selective colleges or universities. The students in the Honors Program build their transcripts with 12 Honor Credits (taking Honors, Dual Credit, and Advanced Placement courses, 10 of which must be earned in grades 9-12), maintain a minimum 3.25 grade point average (unweighted), serve 125 community service hours, and earn a total of 28 credits from the following courses: (Bible=4; English=4; Math=4; Social Studies=4; Science=3; Foreign Language=2; Fine Arts=2; Health/PE=1; Computer/Technology=.5; Electives or additional courses in the previously listed subject areas=3.5).

## Advanced College Preparatory Program

Students in this program take the most rigorous and demanding courses to prepare them for acceptance at selective colleges or universities. The students in the Advanced Program build their transcripts with 15 Honor Credits (taking Honors, Dual Credit, and Advanced Placement courses, 13 of which must be earned in grades 9-12), maintain a minimum 3.5 grade point average (unweighted), serve 150 community service hours, and earn a total of 30 credits from the following courses: (Bible=4; English=4; Math=4; Social Studies=4; Science=4; Foreign Language=3; Fine Arts=2; Health/PE=1; Computer/Technology=.5; Electives or additional courses in the previously listed subject areas=3.5).

## Discounts

### Pastor/Christian Educator Discount

Pastor/Christian worker discount applicants must meet ministry eligibility requirements. Applicants must apply for discounts at enrollment for new students, and annually for returning students.

### Tuition Assistance

Families may apply for tuition assistance after the school has received a completed student enrollment application. CCHS utilizes the services of Financial Assistance for School Tuition ("FAST") to determine financial assistance eligibility. FAST provides the school with a qualification report listing the families eligible for tuition assistance. CCHS will notify the family of the amount awarded. The maximum tuition assistance or incentive discounts granted by Calvary is 50% of the tuition amount. Applications for tuition assistance are available in the school office. You may apply online by linking to the FAST website from the school's website at: [www.cchs.us/admissions/tuition\\_info.cfm](http://www.cchs.us/admissions/tuition_info.cfm).

Tuition assistance is based on the availability of funds and demonstration of need. Tuition assistance must be applied for annually. Financial information is considered strictly confidential and has no effect on the admissions decision. Tuition assistance becomes effective only after the student has completed the enrollment process and has been accepted as a student at Calvary.
