PSAT/ NMSQT

ON WEDNESDAY,
OCTOBER 12

Students in 9th, 10th and 11th grades will participate in the national testing date for the PSAT/NMSQT on **Wednesday, October 12th**. The PSAT is sponsored by the CollegeBoard and is a standardized test that provides firsthand practice for the SAT. Additionally, scores on the PSAT are used to determine course placement for honors and/or AP classes. The PSAT has 3 tests (Reading, Writing and Language, and Math).

Seniors will not take the PSAT; therefore, Seniors are not required to attend school on October 12th. There is the option for Seniors to attend the College Application Assistance Workshop from 10am-Noon in Café One-22. Seniors are expected to attend team or group practices in the afternoon.

CALVARY SENIOR IS A 2023 NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLARSHIP SEMIFINALIST: **JONATHAN P. O'HARROW**

On September 14th, the National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC ©) announced the names of over 16,000 Semifinalists in the 68th annual National Merit Scholarship Program. These academically talented high school seniors have an opportunity to continue in the competition for 7,250 National Merit Scholarships worth nearly \$28 Million dollars that will be offered this spring. To be considered for a Merit Scholarship award, Semifinalists must fulfill several requirements to advance to the Finalist level of competition. Approximately, half of the finalists will win a National Merit Scholarship, earning the Merit Scholar title. The Class of 2023 entered the 2023 National Merit Scholarship Program by taking the 2021 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test, which served as an initial screen of program entrants. The nationwide pool of Semifinalists, less than one percent of US high school seniors, includes the highest-scoring entrants in each state. The number of Semifinalists in a state is proportional to the state's percentage of the national total of graduating seniors.

CCHS is thrilled to congratulate Jonathan P. O'Harrow on his recognition as a National Merit Scholarship Semifinalist. We wish him well as he continues in the program toward National Merit Scholarship Finalist and National Merit Scholar .

Jonathan (J.P.) is the son of Stephen and Janet O'Harrow, and he has attended Calvary Christian High School all four years of his high school career. Prior to attending CCHS, J.P. attended Dunedin Highland Middle School. He is a member of five National Honor Societies, serves as Rho Kappa Honor Society's Treasurer, and is also recognized as an AP Scholar with Distinction. In addition to J.P.'s stellar academic record, he has participated in the Calvary Warriors Athletic program in Varsity Football and Varsity Track & Field. Other notable achievements by J.P. include earning High Honor Roll status each year since 9th grade, the Annual President's Award for Juniors and Seniors, and the National Spanish Exam—Honorable Mention. J.P. is in the process of applying to various universities for the Fall of 2023 and plans to continue his academic studies in Engineering.

CCHS is very proud of J.P. O'Harrow in this wonderful accomplishment.

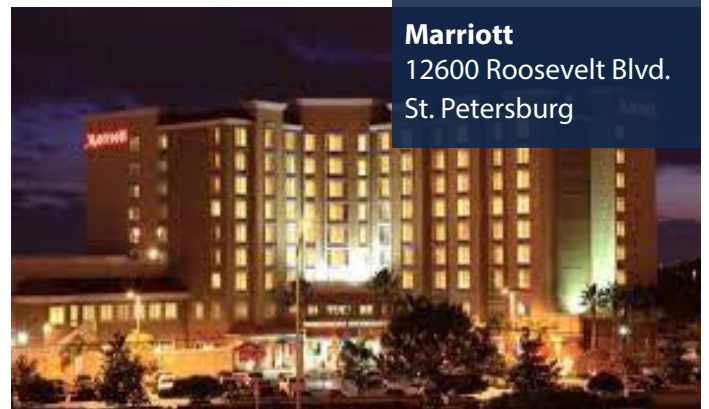
