### HOW WE USE BLOCK SCHEDULE AT CALVARY CHRISTIAN HIGH SCHOOL

Calvary Christian High School will operate on a Block Schedule on **Wednesday, November 1st & Thursday, November 2nd.** CCHS Block Schedule is an exciting chance for students to explore course content in different and unique ways.

By utilizing this occasional Block Schedule, our faculty can fully plan and implement unique and extended learning opportunities for their content area. Such activities might not normally be so readily available during our typical 45-minute period. While CCHS is not considering moving to a Block Schedule format, we do believe that these intentionally spaced and carefully planned Block experiences offer great benefit to our students.

#### Some of the activities that CCHS teachers may use Block Schedule to achieve include:

- Independent assignments that require a sustained focus by the student, but are supported by the teacher as a content expert
- Extended lab opportunities for health and science classes
- AP practice testing that better simulates the timed nature of the national exam for students who seek the AP credit
- Socratic Seminars to encourage students to prepare and participate in complex discussions about course topics
- Project based activities that are benefited by additional time for creation and collaboration
- Expanded writing projects that include process-oriented feedback in real time and guided peer review
- Application of course content to "real world" situations or challenges

Being able to focus exclusively on an area of learning for 90 minutes helps our students build academic stamina, encourages natural curiosity, and permits practice and refinement of skills needed as they prepare for success in college.







Aspen Malasky, CCHS Class of 2026, is a student who exemplifies responsible stewardship and community mindedness. After a span of six months between 2022 and 2023, Aspen suffered three concussions in her softball career as a catcher which ultimately led to her decision to have to give up the game of softball. Instead of a "poor me" inward focused attitude, she and her parents made the conscious decision to focus on God's purpose for her life. Through the concussions and treatments for them, Aspen discovered the Concussion Legacy Foundation (CLF) whose mission is to support veterans, athletes, and all affected by concussions.

Through her new sport of tennis, Aspen spearheaded a fundraising event along with the support of her friends Demi Schwarzkopf ('26) and Abby Armbrust ('26) to bring awareness to concussions and its symptoms, as well as the CLF. Even though she was continuing to feel concussion symptoms, Aspen became determined to put this fundraising event together. On September 30th, the three girls hosted a round robin tennis tournament at Countryside Country Club. They worked to secure donations for all of the supplies and prizes. The event included a silent auction so that by the end of the day, Aspen and her friends raised almost \$9,000 for the Concussion Legacy Foundation. Aspen plans to make this an annual event to be held on the third Friday of September, which is National Concussion Awareness Day.
