
ACADEMIC HONOR SOCIETIES INDUCTION CEREMONY

"I am burdened that **72 million babies** were killed last year in abortion. I asked God what I could do. That's when God gave me the idea to start the *Warriors for Life* club at Calvary. We exist to mobilize students to be a voice that protects babies locally and globally, equip teenagers to defend life through pro-life apologetics, and pray for the ending of abortion.

After being in the maternity home in Nepal, I know how much these homes help protect life – babies and moms. I am in awe that Calvary gets to be a part of creating the **first maternity home in Bangladesh!**"
