

WARRIOR WINTERGUARD

Fine Arts is one of the primary areas of emphasis at CCHS and there are hundreds of students who participate in Fine Arts at CCHS every day. One of the Fine Arts programs that is available to CCHS students is the Warrior Winterguard program, which is under the outstanding leadership of Mr. Stathis Linardos and Mrs. Kacie Morgan. The Warrior Winterguard is a performance ensemble that utilizes dance, flag, rifle, and sabre choreography to go along with a themed soundtrack. The Warrior Winterguard's 2024 show is entitled "Runaway" and has an outer space theme.

During the fall semester, the Warrior Winterguard students join forces with the band students to form the Warrior Marching Band, which performs the halftime show at CCHS home football games and also competes off campus at regional and state marching band competitions. During the spring semester, the Concert Band and Warrior Winterguard programs function independently of one another. As a competitive performance ensemble, the Warrior Winterguard performs at four regional competitions each year and concludes their season at the Florida Federation of Colorguards Circuit (FFCC) State Championships at the Daytona Beach Ocean Center. In 2023, the Warrior Winterguard concluded their season by winning the Bronze Medal in their class at the FFCC State Championships.

The 2024 FFCC Winterguard season is already underway and the Warrior Winterguard has placed in the top three at both of their regional competitions so far this season. Based on the Warrior Winterguard's high level of achievement in 2024, the FFCC is considering promoting the Warrior Winterguard up to a higher classification, which would be considered an honor. The Warrior Winterguard's next competition is at Lakewood Ranch High School on **March 2nd** and they perform at 3:07 PM in the gymnasium. FFCC competitions are open to the public and CCHS students and families are encouraged to cheer on the Warrior Winterguard as they perform and compete!
