# **PATHWAYS:** CCHS STUDENTS DIVE INTO COLLEGE EXPOSURE TRIPS







In February and March, some of CCHS' juniors and sophomores embarked on eye-opening college exposure trips, exploring campuses and envisioning their future paths. Sponsored and led by the CCHS College Counseling Department, these trips were instrumental in providing students with invaluable insights into higher education possibilities.

In February, the students ventured to Florida Atlantic University and Palm Beach Atlantic University, immersing themselves in the atmosphere of collegiate life at a public university and a private, Christian university. From engaging campus tours to informative sessions about academic programs, participants gained firsthand knowledge about what each institution has to offer. These trips weren't just about seeing campuses; they were about helping students identify the "best fit" college experience.

March brought another enriching opportunity, this time to the prestigious University of Florida. CCHS students had the unique opportunity to connect with current UF students and even share a meal with the CCHS alumni who now call UF home. These personal interactions added a layer of depth to their exploration, allowing them to gain insights beyond what brochures and websites could offer.

During the campus tours, students visited through lecture halls, dormitories, and libraries, soaking in the collegiate atmosphere and envisioning themselves as part of these communities. At the heart of these trips lies the goals of the CCHS College Counseling program: to empower students to discern their educational pathways in alignment with their faith and personal values. By exposing them to a variety of college environments, the program equips students with the tools to make informed decisions about their future endeavors. More than just finding a college, it's about discovering a place where they can thrive academically, socially, and spiritually—a place where their talents and passions can flourish in accordance with God's plan for their lives.







### MISSION TRIPS OVER SPRING BREAK

During Spring Break 2024, most students took to the beach, the slopes, or their homes for rest and relaxation. 68 CCHS students and 11 teachers took their love of Jesus and their desire to share the Good News of Jesus to London, Guatemala, and New York City.

The first group of 24 students to depart CCHS, led by Dr. Randall, Pastor Kyle, Coach Safford, and Mrs. Kraus, headed to London to share the gospel in a country that is less than 1% evangelical Christian. The students were split into two teams, Team London and Team Swindon.

Team London stayed in London to support a local church plant and Calvary missionaries by engaging in door to door evangelism, street evangelism, and passing out Easter leaflets! Students were challenged to step outside their comfort zone & face rejection for the sake of sharing the Good News of Jesus with those in such need!

Team Swindon traveled the countryside to the town of Swindon to partner with Calvary missionaries to engage in street evangelism, sharing the gospel and blessing locals by making relational connections and leaving locals with a positive impression of a Christian - in a community with a very cynical view of Christianity and very little God context.

20 CCHS students, led by Mrs. Price, Mrs. Clarke, and Mr. Cave, spent Spring Break in Cobán, Guatemala working alongside the Kechi Baptist Convention to support 5 local indigenous village churches in the area. Daily, students visited homes in the villages and delivered essential food items, read Scripture, sang encouraging Christian songs, shared their testimonies, prayed over specific prayer requests the family members shared in each home, and led VBS style kids activities including teaching a Bible lesson on the Armor of God. Students shared a newfound humility and appreciation for their own homes and families and were amazed by the sheer joy and dedication of the people to serve Jesus in each home they visited.

22 Calvary students, led by chaperones, Mr. Cautero, Mrs. Cheney, Mrs. Seis, and Mr. Strissel flew to New York City to partner with the New York School of Urban Ministry, or NYSUM, led by Pastor Peter DeArruda. NYSUM housed the CCHS mission team in Queens, New York, and provided exceptional training in preparation for their work in the Big Apple. The students repeatedly stepped outside of their comfort zones to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ through service and engagement. The students were deeply moved and are excited about the prospects of bringing what they learned to Tampa Bay for God's Kingdom.

CCHS is proud of these leaders and students who continue to be the hands and feet of Jesus in serving and spreading the Good News of Jesus Christ.

We have been led by an amazing group of Student Government officers this year, and we know that the leaders in 2024-2025 will carry this momentum to positively impact our school as they strive to become servant leaders.
