

#### **UPDATE: Save a Life: Beds and Bricks Campaign Ends**

CCHS Head of School, Mr. Kilgore, expresses his sincere appreciation to Mr. & Mrs. Segraves (Chad and Leslie) and the Warriors for Life Club for leading the school through the Save a Life: Beds and Bricks Campaign. During the 8-week emphasis, CCHS students were informed and taught about the value of all lives because they are created in the image of God. The campaign emphasized the need for "Warriors" to defend all lives, including the preborn lives, to make a difference in our world that has devalued life to the point of selectively murdering the unborn.

Students were challenged to raise \$10,000 to help build the first maternity home in Bangladesh. We did not reach the goal, but donations were received in the amount of \$7,492 that will be given to the project to enable CCHS to have a small part in making a difference to save lives in a country that currently does not have a maternity home.

Additionally, students were challenged to write a poem and to submit artwork that would be chosen to be placed in the maternity home as an encouragement to the mothers living there while waiting for the birth of their child. Congratulations to Sarah Henderson, 9th grade, for having her poem chosen as the winning entry, and congratulations to Lilly Zajac, 9th grade, for having her artwork chosen as the winning entry.

Please mark your calendars, the CCHS Athletic Department will host a sports physical date on campus for returning CCHS student-athletes (not incoming Freshmen.) The event will take place on Tuesday, May 14 from 3:00-6:00 PM in the Anderson Athletic Center Gymnasium. One Medical Center will provide the physicals and will have a male and female doctor available. The cost per physical is \$25. Cash or checks are accepted payment options (checks made out to CCHS). Parents are not required to be present; however, in order for the doctor to complete the physical, the top portion of page 4 of the FHSAA EL2 (4/23 version) Physical Form must be completely filled out and signed by both parent and student with check or cash for \$25. #### Mr. Brandon Martell has Fourth Composition Published



In addition to being the Choral Director at Calvary, Mr. Brandon Martell began a career as a professional composer and arranger of choral music in 2019. He currently has three published works with Excelcia Music Publishing – a company that specializes in repertoire appropriate for elementary, middle, and high school choirs. In 2023, Mr. Martell composed a new piece, entitled "Lighted Ever Onward (The Lamp of Life)," which is a setting of a poem by the Imagist Poet, Amy Lowell. The world premiere of the piece was performed by Braden River High School's top choral ensemble, "River Rhapsody," and the recording and sheet music were sent for review to Galaxy Music Corporation, a company whose body of work includes choral music for more advanced ensembles, such as collegiate and professional choirs. A few weeks ago, Mr. Martell received an email from Dr. Kenney Potter, Vice President of Publications at Galaxy Music, that "Lighted Ever Onward (The Lamp of Life)" has been accepted for publication in their November 2024 catalogue. #### **ASL 4-Honors Students Visit Cross Bayou Elementary School**

CCHS' American Sign Language 4-Honors (ASL-4H) students visited Cross Bayou Elementary School on Friday, April 12th. The purpose of the field trip was to give the ASL students an opportunity to interact with the deaf students at Cross Bayou. The ASL-4H students "showcased" their story telling skills in American Sign Language by engaging the deaf students with interactive learning activities. Mrs. Janessa Jannarone, CCHS ASL-4H teacher, said the visit was heartwarming as she witnessed the CCHS students wholeheartedly immerse themselves in the deaf culture as they interacted with the deaf students at Cross Bayou. By communicating with the students in ASL and through the activities, CCHS students were able to demonstrate the love of Jesus to their deaf peers. The field trip was also encouraging for our ASL students as they experienced the reward of dedicating themselves to four years of learning a language that enabled them to have meaningful conversations and make connections with the deaf community.
