EXAM EXEMPTION REQUESTS

Students will have the opportunity to request Semester 2 Exam Exemptions on **Tuesday, May 14th,** in their Bible class. The grades in teacher gradebooks on **Monday, May 13th, at 7:45 AM** will be the grades used to determine exam exemption eligibility. Students who have work and/or assessments to make up need to make arrangements with their teacher(s) to have the work completed so that the teacher can have the grade entered by **7:45 AM on Monday, May 13th**. Grades entered after that date will not factor in when determining exam exemption eligibility. Students absent from their Bible class on **Tuesday, May 14th,** will have the opportunity to request exam exemptions when they return to school.

SECOND SEMESTER EXAM SCHEDULE ANNOUNCED

Students will take second semester exams on **Monday** through Thursday, May 20th – 23rd. See the exam schedule to the right. If a student does not have an exam during a class period, he/she is not required to attend school for that exam session. Students finishing an exam before the end of the assigned ending time may not leave the classroom until the bell rings to end the exam period. 



Eisenhower Field Day



CO-PUBLISHED AN ARTICLE IN THE CHESTERTON REVIEW

Our CCHS Faculty represent a wide range of backgrounds, interests, and talents. CCHS faculty member Mr. Anthony Gannaio has recently co-published an article in *The Chesterton Review* (Fall/Winter 2023) entitled, "G.K Chesterton and Christopher Dawson: On Conversion and the Relationship Between Christ and Culture." The Chesterton Review, founded in 1974, has been widely praised for both its scholarship and the quality of its writing. The article explores how two famous Christian writers, G.K. Chesterton and Christopher Dawson, took different postures toward the increasingly secular cultures of their day. Mr. Gannaio teaches Latin at CCHS and describes his research interests as the intersection of philosophy, history, Christian theology, and literature.


