2025 SPRING BREAK MISSION TRIPS

During Spring Break 2025, 63 CCHS students traveled around the country and world to share the Gospel and love of Jesus Christ.

Team London:

18 students on Team London were led by Mrs. Kraus, Dr. Randall, Mrs. Jannarone, and Coach Safford. The group spent time working in the communities of WoodGreen and Enfield Lock alongside Ryan King, Zeth, and Hannah Hill. They focused on engaging the communities surrounding Grace Community Church and their new church plant, Grace Church. The team assisted the local pastors in caring for the physical and spiritual needs of the community, spreading the Gospel, and connecting with people in the area.

Team Guatemala:

Mr. Ray, his wife Mrs. Karah Ray, Mr. Cave, and Mrs. Stenberg led 20 students on Team Guatemala. This team used arts, crafts, sports and games to host fun and engaging programs for children each day. They worked alongside local Calvary partners as they served families with children in local communities and shared the name of Jesus in parts of the city that are unreached.

Team New York:

Mrs. Seis, Mr. Cautero, and Ms. Pitt led 21 students on Team New York where they partnered with NYSUM (New York School of Urban Ministries) for five days of ministry outreach in New York City. Students learned about servant leadership, hands-on compassion ministry, and inner-city ministry. They worked alongside NYUSM to reach people through street meetings, soup kitchens and food trucks, kids programs and city shelters.

Team Uganda:

Mrs. Cheryl Rice and Mrs. Sarah Colton led 4 students on Team Uganda. The team participated in large and small group discipleship, evangelism, home visits, and prayer walks sharing the love of Jesus Christ in Kampala. Kampala is a large city where tribes from all over Uganda and East Africa come for work. Many Karamojong know of God but do not truly know Him. This team had the opportunity to share the Gospel with those who are unreached.

CCHS is thankful for the Lord's protection during their travels and are proud of these leaders and students who continue share the Good News of Jesus Christ.
