Spirit Week 2019 Dress-Up Themes

Spirit Week 2019 will be held Monday through Friday, September 30th – October 4th. Each day is a competition between classes to see which class has the most school spirit. Classes earn points from students' participation in the daily dress-up themes and competition events all leading to crowning the class with the most school spirit. The daily dress-up themes are listed below.

<u>Each Day</u> - Clothing must fit in accordance with our dress code with regards to length, modesty, not fitting too tight, and not being too revealing.

Monday - Generation Day- Students should dress in their designated generational theme [Freshman (Babies), Sophomores (Toddlers), Juniors (Adults), Seniors (Senior Citizens)].

Tuesday - Teen Beach Movie: *Surfers vs Bikers* Like the movie, bikers and surfers start a surf and turf war. Students should dress as either a surfer or a biker. There are no designations for what classes should dress as collectively unless specified by the class sponsors.

Wednesday – Group Day – Students should dress alike in groups. The more in a group, the better. For judging purposes, a group must include 3 or more students dressed alike. Groups who represent cultures that would be opposed to the mission of CCHS will be asked to change. For example, nationally known gangs who promote violence, mature-rated programming that promotes gratuitous sexual situations, etc.

Thursday – Theme Day – Students should dress in the clothing of one of the characters of the television network chosen by their class.

School Spirit Day – Students should wear school apparel items with the school's logo or mascot, or wear school colors assigned to their class to demonstrate their school spirit. **Face painting okay on this day.**



Spirit Week 2019 Games and Activities for Class Competition

Monday, 2:10 PM – Guys Volleyball – Each class must enter a team of guys only with girls serving as the coaches. There must be 6 players on the court for play, but when it is time to substitute players, each team must sub 2 players. The first team to reach 15 wins. Each class should have 12 players on their team.

Monday, 6:00 PM – Girls Powder Puff Football – Each class must enter a girls flag football team with guys serving as coaches.

Monday, Cheer Competition – Each class must enter a male cheerleading squad which must perform a cheer or routine at a designated time during the Powder Puff football games.

Tuesday – Tug of War – 2:15 PM– Students from each class will pick teams of 10 guys and 10 girls to compete. Various games will be played for varying point values.

Wednesday – Protect Your Princess – 2:15 PM – Students from each class will have 2 minutes to build a fort to protect their Princess (1 girl from each class). The dodgeball competition begins between two classes to eliminate the soldiers, and eventually the Princess. The class who eliminates the Princess wins the game. Each class will pick 2 groups of 10 students to play dodgeball and 1 Princess.

Thursday – Class Video Skit Day – 2:00 PM – Each class must produce a thematic video. The video needs to be 5-6 minutes long and will be judged on creativity, special effects, theme, and class participation. Videos must be submitted to Mr. Dupeé on Wednesday, October 3rd by 10 am for review by administration. At Least 10% of the class must participate in the performance and the production of the video.

Friday – Pep Rally – 2:15 PM – The class with the most school spirit during the competition cheers will win the competition for the day. Games will be led by Cheer Coaches and Staff.


