Students to Take PSAT on Wednesday, October 16th

Students in 9th, 10th and 11th grades will participate in the national testing date for the PSAT on **Wednesday, October 16th.** The PSAT is sponsored by the College Board and is a standardized test that provides firsthand practice for the SAT. The PSAT measures:

- Critical Reading Skills
- Math Problem-Solving Skills
- Writing Skills



What Does the School Expect?

Calvary expects students to always do their best on the PSAT and other standardized tests. For the results to be an accurate assessment, it is **very important** that each student do his or her best on the test. Parents, please encourage your child to focus and give his/her best on the PSAT. We do use the PSAT results to determine eligibility for Honors and AP classes.

School Will Dismiss at 12:15 PM on October 16th

School will dismiss at 12:15 PM on October 16th for CCHS students. After-school supervision will not be available. Unless a student has a team or group practice after dismissal, he/she must make necessary preparations to leave campus at 12:15 PM. Seniors will not attend school on the 16th except those who are interested in attending the college application palooza. Seniors are expected to attend team or group practices in the afternoon.

The Test that Leads to Scholarships

On Wednesday, October 16th, juniors will take the PSAT/NMSQT. The acronym NMSQT stands for National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test. Only juniors taking the PSAT qualify for their scores to be in the NMSQT for scholarship opportunities. Juniors will be instructed to check "Yes" to the Student Search Service question on the test day answer sheet if they want their scores to be shared with scholarship partners. By checking "Yes," it will allow additional scholarship partners to find your students—there's over \$300 million in scholarships available! You may view some of the scholarship partners below, and you may learn more about the National Merit Scholarship Corporation at the second link. A scholarship partner may be a company you work for which could be an even more incentive for your child to request his/her scores be shared with the scholarship partners. Last year, we had a student receive a scholarship through the UPS Foundation based on her scores on the PSAT/NMSQT. Select the links below for more information.

Parents of seniors in search of free money to help pay for college are asked to talk to your senior about an email sent to them by Ms. Troutman on October 2nd. It is never too early to start searching for college scholarship opportunities. Underclassmen may begin searching and applying now. To start, visit the **CCHS College Counseling website** for scholarship search engines.

The following scholarships are available to underclassmen and/or to current college students:

- VFW Voices of Democracy for 9th-12th grades (and "Patriot's Pen for 6-8th graders)
- <u>Jack Kent Cooke Foundation-</u> "Young Scholars Program" (8th-11th grades)--Winter, 2020 deadline and "Undergraduate Transfer Scholarship" (Nov 20th deadline)
- <u>Society for Manufacturing Engineers</u> has an option for students already in college pursuing this program of study

Scholly App Platform

Philosophically, CCHS does not recommend paying services for college scholarship opportunities. Recently, Kelsey Tainsh spoke at a school assembly. In her presentation, she referenced the Scholly app and how she found scholarships through their service. Her endorsement of the app generated some questions about the app and program. The Scholly Platform charges \$44.99 per year to permit access to their scholarship database. Again, it is not something the school recommends, but parents may decide if it is worth the investment to search for college scholarship.
