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Dress-Down Day on Wednesday to Raise Funds for Blessing Box Project

CCHS student leaders will sponsor a dress-down day on Wednesday, January 8th with all funds raised from the dress-down day being donated to the Blessing Box Project. The Blessing Box Project is led by CCHS junior, Bella Pawloski. The cost to participate in the dress-down day is \$3.

What is a Blessing Box? It is a box stocked with nonperishable food items, hygiene products and household items for neighbors who need them. The Little Free Pantry Project provides the opportunity to help build a sense of community while providing for those in need.

What are the needs?

- 16 percent of Pinellas County's population, nearly 150,000 people, identify as food insecure.
- Nearly one in four of the county's children, 39 thousand, are food insecure. To compare, nationally one in five are food insecure.

What are the project goals?

- Assist in ending the cycle of poverty by removing barriers and providing pathways for families with young children so that they have opportunities to succeed and thrive.
- Ensure Early Grade Success: Increase the number of low income children reading at grade level through proper nutrition
- Build Security: Increase the percent of adults and children who are financially and food secure.
- Support Those in Need: Meet the basic needs of families and individuals through investments in food, housing and other essentials.

CCHS Donor Scholarship Applications Now Open for Class of 2020

CCHS is blessed to receive donations designated for college tuition scholarships for CCHS students. Applications for the following scholarships are now open for students in the Class of 2020. The applications deadline is January 17th. Seniors received an email from Ms. Holderby on December 6th with a link to each scholarship application.

Biblical Worldview Scholarship Possible award of up to \$10,000 per year for students who want to be further grounded in a Biblical worldview by attending one of the 14 Christ-centered colleges/universities listed on the application. Applicants must share testimony of faith in Christ, have a strong academic record, and share record of participation in ministries and/or service opportunities. The scholarship is renewable for up to three years if student remains in good standing as outlined on the application.

Doyle Communication Excellence Scholarship \$2500 one-time award: Applicants must have a 2.75 unweighted, cumulative GPA, demonstrate excellent written communication abilities, and share evidence of living out Christian compassion through community service.

Doyle Technology Scholarship \$2500 one-time award: Applicants must have a 2.75 unweighted, cumulative GPA, plans to major in a STEM (science, technology, engineering, math) program of study, share evidence of living out Christian compassion through community service, and submit evidence of technology aptitude verified by a CCHS faculty member.

Entrepreneurial Leadership Scholarship: Available only to current students enrolled in Entrepreneurial Leadership. Must also have a 2.75 unweighted, cumulative GPA.
