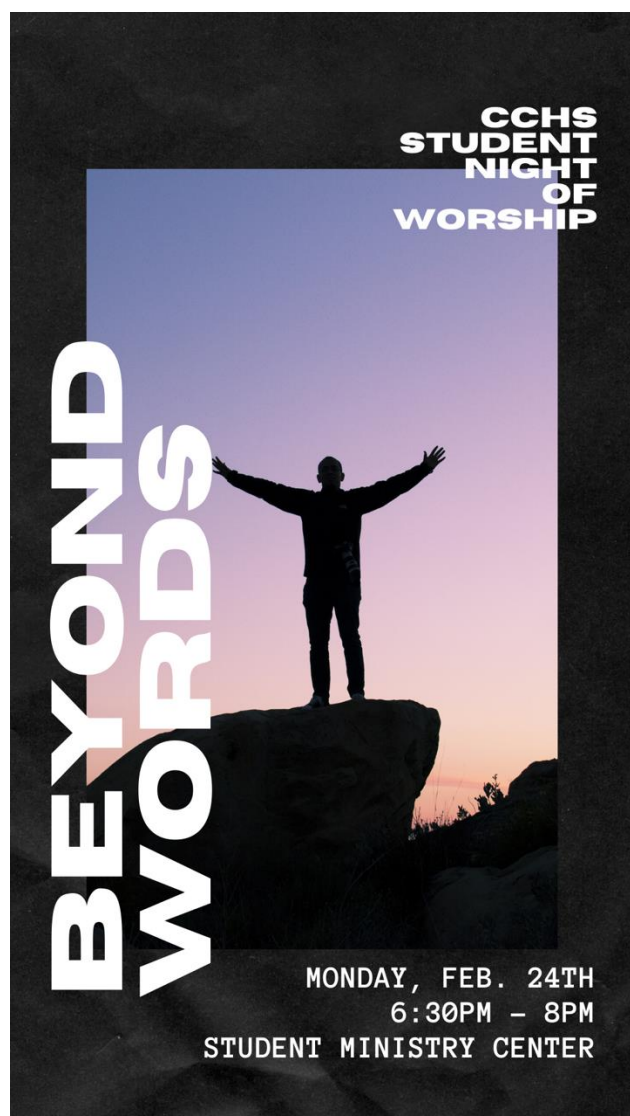

The missionaries work with children each week and informed our mission trip sponsors they could use the following supplies on a continual basis. Youth Leadership Pinellas is a series of interactive days designed to educate high school teens on community resources and issues, develop an excellence in leadership, build teamwork skills, and foster involvement in community services. YLP is a seven-month program operating from October through April. Students engage in six full-day sessions, plus an orientation retreat and graduation dinner. During each program day, the students have the opportunity to meet community decision makers and to engage them in frank, off-the-record discussions on current issues. By coming face to face with community leaders and proactive spokesmen in these various areas, graduates of YLP are better prepared to assume leadership roles of their own. Each year a representative group of 40 tenth, eleventh and twelfth grade students are selected to participate from high schools throughout Tampa Bay.
