Summer learning loss is a well-documented and frequently researched phenomenon that affects students of all grade levels and aptitudes. The best studies find that students lose on average a month, and up to three months in some cases, of grade-level instruction over the summer break. This same research shows that the amount of loss can increase with grade level. Therefore, the English Department of CCHS encourages students to participate in summer reading. Reading from the list below is designed to help students overcome summer learning loss and to prepare them for the upcoming year of academic growth. Both students and their parents are encouraged to take summer reading seriously and complete the reading assignment as instructed on the following page.

This assignment applies to ALL students taking English IV and English IV Honors.

As you will see below, there are different reading requirements for the various English I courses. You may obtain and read the book in any format comfortable to you. In addition to this reading assignment, Honors students must read the book of the Bible listed below. During the first full week of school, all students will take an assessment in class over the comprehension of their chosen book. Also during the first full week of school, all students will compose an in-class writing based on the summer reading assignment. Honors students will have an additional assignment within the first three weeks of school covering the Bible reading assignment.

The assessment and essay required of all students will count for 10% of the first quarter classwork grade average.
