
PSAT TESTING DAY

Students in 9th, 10th and 11th grades will take the PSAT/NMSQT on **Thursday, October 16th**. The PSAT is an online standardized test administered by the College Board and cosponsored by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation that tests skills in reading, writing and math. This test is required for all CCHS students in grades 9-11.

Scores on the PSAT are used to determine course placement for Honors, AP and Dual Credit classes and are reported to the state of Florida for all students receiving a state-based scholarship. If a student receives a Step Up for Students Scholarship, a PSAT score from this school year is required in order to maintain eligibility. Students have access to a practice test in the Bluebook app on their school iPad. Free breakfast items will be available on test day beginning at 7:30 AM, and after school supervision will not be available. Unless a student has a team or group practice after dismissal, students must make necessary preparations to leave campus by **11:30 AM**.

HALF DAY OF SCHOOL FOR STUDENTS ON OCTOBER 16TH

Due to PSAT testing, students in grades 9-11 will be dismissed at **11:15 AM**, and seniors are not required to attend school on October 16th.

DURING CHILDHOOD CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

September is Childhood Cancer Awareness Month, and there was an overwhelming outpouring of encouragement at CCHS's Gold Together games. So far this year, **\$6,500** has been raised, bringing the total support for Gold Together over the years at CCHS to more than **\$45,500**. May the Lord use these efforts to bring comfort, encouragement, and the light of Christ to families walking through the difficult journey of childhood cancer. CCHS will continue to host Gold Together games throughout the school year.
