ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

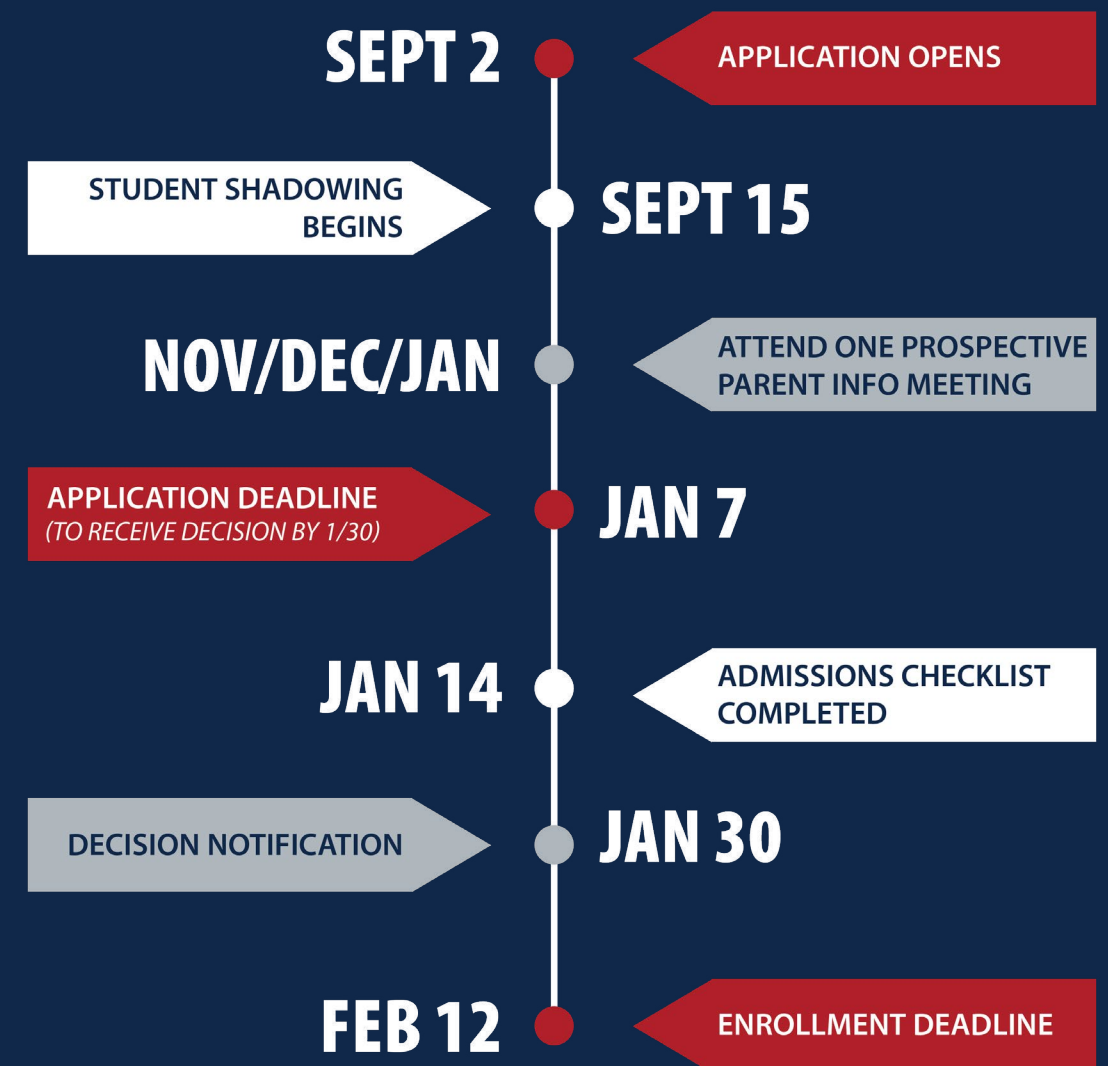
- The student demonstrates critical thinking skills shown through grades, standardized test scores and academic rigor.
